Cyclist Bikes Cross Country for Charity

Drew Marinelli's trek followed on Facebook, Twitter and with GPS technology

(KEY WEST, Fla.) - Cyclist and activist Drew Marinelli (www.onemanonebikeonefight.com) began a 6-month, 6,000-mile trek across the nation today to raise support for the World Food Program, the United Nations frontline agency in the fight against global hunger.

Marinelli set off from Key West, Florida and plans to finish in San Francisco later this summer, possibly as early as mid-August. Marinelli's route takes him through 15 states, where he will stop to speak to Rotary and school groups about his experiences in Niger, West Africa, where he spent two years volunteering with the Peace Corps. While in Niger, he worked to teach villagers how to plant fruit trees and improve farming practices, but increasing food prices, natural disasters and climate change continue to cause widespread starvation there. Drew hopes his cross country tour will help more people understand and support the World Food Program, and lead to donations to the WFP through his website.

Marinelli has a strong following, from family in South Carolina to friends from Africa to California. Friends follow Marinelli online through Facebook and Twitter and his progress is trackable thanks to a partnership with personal satellite messaging and emergency communications provider SPOT Satellite GPS Messenger. "Andrew's adventure is for a very worthy cause and SPOT is proud to support his mission and provide real-time tracking online so others can share in his journey and follow him along the way," said Derek Moore, Public Relations Manager for SPOT LLC.
